# From Our Head of School



Now that the dust has settled, post our KHDA inspection, I wanted to take this opportunity to provide you with some of the highlights. A full update will be provided at our KHDA Feedback session on Sunday morning at 9:00 in the DP Lounge, 3rd floor of the Secondary building.

While still yet to be confirmed officially, we celebrate that we have retained a 'Good' status, this is extremely positive progress as we have shifted to the far end of the 'Good'; band and are now firmly positioned to move to Very Good.

With regards to specific progress we managed to move up 13 indicators and to have 3 of the 5 Leadership and Management indicators increase. It was equally satisfying, in the first year of our Diploma Programme to have all 16 DP indicators rated 'Good' or 'Very Good' (as it took four years to achieve that in our other two programs). This should give all our parents confidence regarding our young Secondary school, as the provisions there are very strong.

Equally worthy of celebration was a positive movement in our Arabic Progress ratings, moving up two indicators. This is reflective of the hard work of the teaching team to improve practice. There is much work to be done here but we are seeing some initial progress worthy of celebrating.

However, most importantly for me, our parent surveys stood us in a much better light this year than in any previous years. With 100% of parents stating 'Students are happy at school', Students learn well most of the time because of effective teaching', and 'Overall I am satisfied with the quality of education at my school' and that 'Students are developing good awareness of the UAE and other culture'. To name but a few areas to celebrate.

Our sincere appreciation to our parents who made the time to meet with KHDA reviewing team and the to fill out the survey.

Official label aside, while we know there are many areas to improve I am confident we are functioning as a 'Very Good' to 'Outstanding' school. Our accreditation in time will reflect that. For now, we celebrate we are a school that continues to make excellent progress, in a community that values all stakeholders.

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Dear GIS Parents,

As you are aware re-enrollments are in process. We encourage you to complete this process, at the earliest.

We are pleased to share that there will be a 15% discount in fees for a third child, 25% discount for a fourth child and 50% for a fifth child for the academic year 2018/19.

All parents are required to pay a deposit of 10% of the annual school fee per child (please see the fee schedule below) in order to secure your child's place at GEMS International School for the academic year 2018 – 2019. This re-enrolment fee will be due by 22nd March.

Important points to note about the re-enrolment fee:

- The re-enrolment process applies to all parents wishing their child/children to return to GEMS International School in September 2018. This process applies to all students including company paid accounts. Parents who normally have their school fees covered directly by their employer will need to make this payment themselves, and then seek reimbursement from their employer.
- This deposit is fully deductible against the first term fees.

- This deposit is fully refundable should your circumstances change, and
- 1. Your family relocates outside Dubai
- 2. Grade 10 students who have paid to secure their place for Sept 2018 and do not acquire the predicted grades to proceed with the full IB Diploma are also able to request a refund of the re-enrolment fee. A letter from the DP Coordinator will be required for the refund.
- If you do not complete the re-enrolment process before 22nd March, the system will automatically generate a Transfer Certificate request and places will be offered to incoming students.
- If you are not re-enrolling for September 2018, this process still needs to be completed. The re-enrolment process will prompt a Transfer Certificate to be generated as part of your leaving documents.
- GEMS Staff will require their employee number in order to complete the re-enrolment process

You will be able to re-enroll your child by logging into Oasis (https://oasis.gemseducation.com/General/Home.aspx) and completing the re-enrolment process. This will provide you the opportunity to pay online with a credit card or you are welcome to pay at the school accounts office. For instructions, please see attached. The de-

posit can only be accepted by the Accounts Department once your re-enrolment process is complete on Oasis.

By re-enrolling your child, you agree that the terms and conditions communicated in your Parent School Contract shall continue to apply.

As you will have already heard and read, we are extremely proud of the positive direction the school is moving. This was most recently reflected in the oral feedback we received from KHDA and from you as a parent community. While we take time to celebrate all of the wonderful things taking place, we recognize that the journey is ongoing and we can reflect on some feedback and clarifications that are required. I would like to specifically address the area of 'Health and Safety'.

- 1. Fire drills and evacuation: In line with the civil defense requirements, three planned drills take place annually. Drills are announced and communicated to the community in advance via the newsletter. Unplanned evacuations have and will occur, most recently during our International Day. When this happens, it is imperative that all procedures are followed and the building is evacuated as per the instructions from the appointed fire marshals in school. Vehicles are not permitted to move while students, staff and school visitors are being evacuated and all people on site are expected to assemble at the nominated assembly points.
- 2. ID badges and contact details: Please ensure that you wear your ID badge at all times when on school campus and contact details are updated in OASIS.
- 3. Attendance and punctuality: Students should be in class and ready to learn before the UAE national anthem is played. Any time after this, they are considered late and are required to sign in at reception. If your child is going to be absent, you must complete a leave application form. This form must have enough details in order for

the school to either authorize or decline the application. Acceptable reasons for approved absences include illness, visa renewal or family bereavement. Unacceptable reasons include going to a concert, shopping, missing the bus or going on family vacation. Absences will be reflected on students' report cards and excessive unauthorized absences will be considered when graduating students to the next grade level. If the absence is unplanned, please contact the school reception and the child's homeroom teacher immediately to inform them accordingly. This must be followed up with an absence form.

- 4. After school supervision: Regular classes finish at 3:20 except for Tuesdays, when they finish at 1:45. ECAs generally finish at 4:15. Parents should be prompt when picking up children and they should remain in their presence and care when on school grounds. If you are late, students will be directed to the canteen where you are expected to come and sign them out.
- 5. Counselors: The school has three full time counselors who are here to work with and support our students and you as families. They can assist and provide parenting tips, career guidance, how to support teenagers, social media awareness and protection, and other personal, social and emotional issues. Should you wish to speak with them, please reach out to them directly.

Again I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support especially during our KHDA inspection. The feedback from both the online survey and face to face conversations that many of you had with the team were overwhelmingly positive, so sincerely, thank you!








# Let's Do Lunch - Update

# Important Announcements

Clinic- GEMS International School in compliance with Dubai Health Authority (DHA) is planning to conduct the routine vaccinations.

Vaccination will be held in school premises and will be given by authorized doctors and nurses of DHA. The only vaccines the DHA will provide are Oral Polio (OPV), Diphtheria Pertussis Tetanus (DPT/Td), and Measles Mumps Rubella (MMR) booster doses. This service is ONLY applicable to students from Grade 1 and above who are due for these boosters.

Please note that it is essential that the original updates colored vaccination card copy along with the signed consent form be submitted to the school clinic by 15 March in order for the student to receive immunization. The consent form can be downloaded here

Not only was this a fantastic student initiated event which helped foster our students leadership skills, but it will also benefit numerous patients who need blood transfusions in the future. # **Word Study**

In response to feedback from parents, the be-



low details our philosophy and how we teach word study at GIS. The purpose of word study is twofold. Firstly, we believe that students need to develop a general knowledge of English spelling. Therefore GIS, they learn how to examine words through active explo-

ration using a hands-on, manipulative approach. Students also discover generalizations about spelling, instead of just spelling rules. Secondly, word study increases students' specific knowledge of words. Specific knowledge relates to the spelling and meaning of individual words. Using the Words Their Way inventories for pre-assessments, teachers can determine what stage of spelling development each student is.

These stages describe students' spelling behavior as they move from one level of word knowledge to the next. Knowing these will help teachers determine which word study activities are most appropriate for students.

A key feature of the Word Study at GIS is the use of 'WOW' and 'WONKY' words. 'WOW' words are new vocabulary words that students can inquire into. They may arise from independent inquiry, reading different texts in class or from units of inquiry. 'WONKY' words are personalized words that students are spelling incorrectly, they are typically high frequency (sight/tricky) words that a child should know at that developmental age. They can be found in the child's own writing and can be self, peer and teacher assessed until they are consistently spelled correctly. Word study is an ongoing, everyday program that is incorporated into all the elements of Balanced Literacy.

Many students find word study to be one of the most enjoyable components of balanced literacy instruction. Teachers find it to be one of the most powerful. That's because reading ability dramatically improves as students use meaningful games and activities to discover:

- Letters and the sounds they make
- How to pick out root words
- How suffixes and prefixes can change the meaning
- Spelling involves finding patterns
- How to get clues to word meaning and pronunciation
- It involves problem solving in the form of developing hypotheses, searching for patterns, predicting outcomes, and experimenting to find out if they're right.
- Using word study activities, students compare new words to words they already know and look for connections.



Grade three students inquired into city systems and how efficient cities require strategic planning. They began the unit by comparing and contrasting the city of Dubai from the past to the present. Specifically, looking at major systems and how they developed and expanded throughout the growth of the city. In math, the students analyzed and identified attributes of two and three dimensional shapes, as well as exploring different angles in real-life situations. In language, the focus was on explanatory texts and writing to explain the purpose and importance of city systems. Mr. Binoy Panicker a Senior Urban Designer, came

to visit the students to speak about the process of planning a new city, the key components and tools that are used to form an effective city plan. Students had a sneak peek into a new development in the Middle East, which is planned to be developed within the next few years. The students gained a greater understanding of the process behind the design, of the beautiful city that we all live in. As their summative task, the students designed their own three dimensional city model and identified their strategic planning process by following the given success criteria.

MYP Music Night was an exciting night with a mixture of styles, ensembles and soloists performing to a captivated audience. Thank you to all that supported the lovely evening.


