The year 2018 marks 100 years since the birth of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the Founding Father of the UAE, who passed away in 2004.

To commemorate this historic national occasion, His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the United Arab Emirates declared 2018 as the Year of Zayed.

The Year of Zayed features a series of events and initiatives in the UAE and internationally, designed to commemorate the memory of the late Sheikh Zayed, and showcase his impact and legacy, and promote the values that he displayed throughout his life in creative and interactive ways.

Consistent with the values of the late Sheikh Zayed, it is intended that the Year of Zayed involved people of all ages, nationalities, faiths and backgrounds in the UAE and internationally.

One of the Year of Zayed projects was The Sheikh Zayed awards, set to honor the late great Sheikh Zayed. These awards were hosted by GEMS Education and had 46 participating schools.

Our Schools project was run by Jana Al Ballany, a Grade 8 student at GIS and Grade 7 at the time of the projects Inception. Jana, came up with the concept #Smiles4Zayed to reflect Sheikh Zayed's incredible values and heart for others.

The concept was a relatively simple one, capture and spread smiles throughout the UAE and the rest of the world. Essentially pay it forward! Jana began the campaign and due to her leadership and infectious spirit was able to bring a large group of followers on board. Soon the project grew and impacted hundreds of thousands of people not only in the UAE but around the globe.

This week we were delighted to learn the students were finalists, and placed 3rd of the 46 projects that entered. The team walked away with 5000AED to continue their great work. I could not be prouder of Jana and her #Smiles4Zayed team, for all they achieved and for living the values of GIS and the IB Learner Profile so well.

As I write this we have also concluded a wonderful international day, there will be more on this in the next Hayatona but for now I offer my most sincere appreciation to all families and faculty for their participation and contribution to a wonderful event.

At the Wadi Showka Dam Park, we learned about the uses of dams and how important water is for survival of both plants and humans in the U.A.E. As we hiked through the paths, our hiking guides took us on a journey to discover how Bedouins used to live, including an old house built out of rocks! As responsible citizens in this global world, our Grade Twos are becoming more environmentally aware and are learning to understand the impact they have in preserving these natural habitats.


