Visiting the Spring Carnival

- School pick-up is unchanged for this day, 3:20 PM as usual.
- Parents are welcome from 2PM onwards to visit the booths.

 Children can be signed out also from 2PM but they must be supervised by parents. All sign-out protocols must be followed but don't worry, homeroom teachers will also have their sign-out books with them to assist you in this and avoid congestion at reception.
- Children should not be left after school to attend the carnival without a parent to supervise them. Should you be unable to attend but don't want your child to miss out, you must inform the homeroom teacher in writing (as you would do normally) who is responsible for your child at this time.
- If your child normally travels home by bus and will be collected by you on Thursday, please ensure you notify your homeroom teacher of this.
- Once the buses have left to take students home, this parking will also become available for parents.

Parent/Student Booths

- All students running booths are permitted to leave class up to 2 hours in advance (12PM) to set up. If you are running a booth with your child, please note this time carefully.
- Grades 10 12 student volunteers will be on hand to support parents and students at this time and throughout the day.
- The sign-up for booths has now closed.
- Booths will be open from 2-6PM
- Items for sale will range from 1AED and up, games will be for approximately 5AED. Burgers and drinks will be comparable to what you pay externally. It is advisable not to send money to school with your child, especially the younger students however if you are, please take note of the prices if you're looking for guidance.

Harmony Choir at ChoirFest



GIS Junior Jaguars Team 1 Take Overall Win in ESKC Series 2019.



ubai, UAE, 11 March: Going into the final Junior division round of the Emirates Schools Karting Championship (ESKC) on Monday night at Dubai Kartdrome, GEMS Wellington Academy Silicon Oasis (GEMS WSO) controlled the championship, but the team was to fall prey to the runner-up team of GEMS International School (GIS) Team in the final decisive round.

Nathan Pope, Saeed Al Zarooni and Sultan Kurdali of

GIS Team 1 needed to make up a deficit of two championship points in the ESKC category going into the last round, and the team delivered by winning Round Four, racking up 159 championship points and walking away with the 2018–2019 ESKC Junior Challenge title, topping GEMS WSO (155 points) by four points.



The team consistently delivered podium finishes through all four rounds starting in January, and through their determination, motivation and healthy team-spirit were able to walk away with the overall series trophy.

GIS Team 2, consisting of Umar Noor, Nikolas Hansen and Alex Hansen also pulled of a remarkable 7th place out of the 17 competing teams with first-time competing drivers.



KHDA Wellbeing Census

The KHDA Wellbeing Census launched in 2017. The five-year project aims to improve student wellbeing and supports Dubai's vision to be among the five happiest cities in the world by 2021.

It also provides insight into student attitudes towards their experiences in and out of school. At present, the contractor is seeking the various authority approvals and should there be any change, further notification will be sent.












Raffle tickets are still available for sale in the reception during the mornings and afterschool.

We ask every student to bring a small prize (not more than 10 AED) next week which can be dropped off in the reception. These prizes will be used for the game booths.


